## **BAL RATING INFO**

BAL (Bushfire Attack Level) measures the risk of a building's potential exposure to ember attack, radiant heat and flame impact. BAL assessments are used to keep you safe, and to prevent the spread of fire to other locations. Council is funding all BALs for those who lost their homes in the summer bushfires.

#### DO I NEED TO BUILD TO MY BAL RATING?

Yes. Failing to do so would mean your property DA is not approved.

#### WHAT DOES AN FZ OR 40 RATING MEAN? A

rating of 40 means you are required to use highly flame-resistant materials, and you must eliminate elements that can increase the spread of flames, embers or radiant heat. An FZ is the highest rating, which puts your property at risk from the flame zone. Rebuilding is not recommended in FZ zones.

#### WHEN WILL MY BAL RATING BE DONE?

Assessing for BAL ratings takes time. Garry Cooper, our BAL officer, has assessed 100 properties so far, working on a maximum of five per day. If you would like to register your property for a free BAL rating assessment, contact our front office on 6499 2222.

#### Second round of Disaster Relief Fund delivered

A total of 317 local households have received cash payments of \$500 as the second round of the Bega Valley Community Disaster Relief Fund rolled out in late August. A total of \$158,500 was paid to people impacted by the summer bushfires. Council is working with the Social Justice Advocates of the Sapphire Coast to determine third round targeting.
